ABOUT OUR REPORT

- Our data is purely based on the 76,737 jobs posted by higher education institutions in the UK and Republic of Ireland on jobs. ac.uk from August 1st 2021 to July 31st 2022
- Our top-level statistics state the actual number of job adverts
- When we focus on the segmented job categories, we refer to job opportunities rather than adverts, as some adverts spanned several disciplines or featured different job roles. Therefore a specific advert may feature in different areas of this report and the number of job opportunities is higher than the number of adverts
- In our report we rounded numbers to the nearest whole number except where numbers were less than 0.5
- Where data has been segmented into different job roles we didn't include categories with less than 5 opportunities as there wasn't enough data to inform trends
- When we refer to 'Average Apply Clicks', we refer only to clicks made directly to the 'Apply' button

Executive summary

jobs.ac.uk advertises a diverse range of academic, research and teaching opportunities across the UK, Ireland and beyond. This report offers a real insight into 19 different roles. providing all kinds of useful information from average salaries, peak recruitment times and locations advertised to the percentage of roles offered on a temporary, permanent, full-time and part-time basis.

TRENDS

- 76% of lecturer roles are offered on a permanent basis, a 10% increase on last year
- Reader roles offer lots of stability with 93% offered on permanent contracts and 97% on a full-time basis
- Most research roles are offered on a contracted/ temporary basis due to being project based and reliant on funding
- Generally senior level roles are advertised for longer and also attract less views and apply clicks because they require niche skills and leadership experience, making the talent pool for these roles smaller

- 76,737 adverts were posted on jobs.ac.uk by higher education institutions in the UK and Republic of Ireland during 2021/22
- On average adverts attracted 467 views and 24 apply clicks
- On average adverts for academic, research and teaching roles attracted over 600 views
- The average length an advert was posted for was 23 days
- 43% of opportunities advertised were for academics, researchers and teachers
- Opportunities in the professional and support roles increased to 52% of all roles advertised, compared with 30% last year
- 87% of the adverts were for full-time roles
- 55% of the adverts were for permanent roles
- Lecturer opportunities make up 32% of the academic roles advertised on jobs.ac.uk, a 9% increase on last year
- 40% of all academic jobs on jobs.ac.uk are research roles
- 43% of the adverts were placed by institutions in London and the South East of England



- On average recruitment adverts on jobs.ac.uk were posted for 23 days, attracting 467 views and 22 apply clicks
- 43% of these opportunities were for academic, research and teaching jobs
- 52% of these opportunities were for professional and support roles
- Overall 37% of opportunities were within the salary band £30,000 £39,999
- 87% of the opportunities were full-time and 45% contract/temporary
- The main recruitment locations were South East England 24%, London 19%, Northern England 19% and Midlands 14%



Academic, research and teaching

Overview of all UK and Ireland roles placed on jobs. ac.uk in 2021/2022



- On average academic, research and teaching job adverts on jobs.ac.uk were posted for 24 days, attracting 620 views and 29 apply clicks
- The main recruitment locations were Northern England 21%, South East England 20%, London 18% and Midlands 14%
- 86% of academic, research and teaching opportunities were offered on a full-time basis
- 54% of these opportunities were offered on a contract/temporary basis
- 52% of these roles were marketed at £30,000 £39,999 with 17% at £40,000 £49,999

A breakdown of the categories and academic disciplines.

Our four academic categories mirror the REF (Research Excellence Framework) categories. The REF is the system used for assessing the quality of research in UK higher education institutions. Some roles may feature in more than one category. For example, if a particular job spanned Biological Science and Computer Science it would feature in categories A&B.








Chair

- These roles are advertised for longer than other academic roles to attract top talent and allow time for enquiries
- Generally these opportunities don't advertise the salary and welcome contact between the applicant and institution
- The highest % of chair roles were advertised in Category C, the percentages are more than 100% as these roles cross disciplines
- The highest % of chair roles were advertised in Scotland
- While opportunities for these roles were spread out throughout the year, there was a slight peak in March





Clinical Lecturer / Senior Lecturer

- As well as teaching responsibilities, clinical lecturer roles involve leading research groups or spending some time working in a healthcare setting
- As these are speciality roles with smaller pools of candidates, they attract lower views and are usually advertised for longer
- Most of these roles are offered on a full-time basis (69%), although a few clinical lecturer roles are offered on a part-time basis
- 42% of these opportunities were marketed with a salary between £30,000 £39,999
- There is a good balance between permanent (55%) and contract/temporary roles (45%)
- Naturally the main discipline for these roles is Category A

- A high % of these roles are based in London, largely because of Imperial College London and University College London clinical trials units
- The majority of these roles are marketed at £30,000 £39,999
- Naturally the main discipline for these roles is Category A

Dean

- Deans are heads of faculties and departments
- Dean opportunities attract higher than average views and are usually advertised for longer
- These roles tend to be offered full-time and permanent owing to their senior nature and need for long-term stability. A few are offered on a temporary basis, likely covering a leave of absence on an interim basis
- As you'd expect, these roles are spread out fairly evenly across the UK
- Salaries for these roles are generally not disclosed because they are likely open to negotiation depending on skills and experience
- Most dean roles are advertised in Category C



- Lecturers are highly sought after with much higher views and apply rates
- Many of these roles offer the security of permanent employment (76% compared to the jobs.ac.uk academic average of 46%)
- Lecturer opportunities make up 33% of the academic roles advertised on jobs.ac.uk
- May was the busiest month for advertising opportunities for lecturers
- 80% of lecturer roles offer salaries between £30,000 £49,999
- Most lecturer roles advertised were in Category C
























