#### **ABOUT OUR REPORT**

- Our data is purely based on the 50,155 jobs posted by higher education institutions in the UK and Republic of Ireland on jobs.ac.uk from 1 August 2020 to 31 July 2021
- Our top-level statistics state the actual number of job adverts
- When we focus on the segmented job categories, we refer to job opportunities rather than adverts, as some adverts spanned several disciplines or featured different job roles. Therefore a specific advert may feature in different areas of this report and the number of job opportunities is higher than the number of adverts
- In our report we rounded numbers to the nearest whole number except where numbers were less than 0.5
- Where data has been segmented into different job roles we didn't include categories with less than five opportunities as there wasn't enough data to inform trends
- When we refer to 'Average Apply Clicks', we refer only to clicks made directly on the 'Apply' button


### **Executive summary**


jobs.ac.uk advertises a diverse range of academic, research and teaching opportunities across the UK, Ireland and beyond. This report offers a real insight into 19 different job types, providing all kinds of useful information from average salaries, peak recruitment times and locations advertised to the percentage of roles offered on a temporary, permanent, full-time and part-time basis.

#### TRENDS

- 81% of lecturer roles are offered on a permanent basis compared to the jobs.ac.uk academic average of 38%
- Reader roles offer lots of stability with 94% offered on permanent contracts and 99% on a full-time basis
- Many research roles are offered on a contract/ temporary basis due to being project based and reliant on funding
- Generally senior level roles are advertised for longer and also attract less views and apply clicks because they require niche skills and leadership experience, making the talent pool for these roles smaller

- 50,155 adverts were posted on jobs.ac.uk by higher education institutions in the UK and Republic of Ireland during 2020/21
- On average adverts attracted 645 views and 25 apply clicks
- On average adverts for academic, researcher and teaching roles attracted over 700 views
- The average length of time of an advert was posted for was 25 days
- 63% of opportunities advertised were for academics, researchers and teachers
- 30% of opportunities advertised were for Professional and Support roles
- 87% of the adverts were for full-time roles
- 58% of the adverts were for permanent roles
- Lecturer opportunities make up 23% of the academic roles advertised on jobs.ac.uk
- 46% of all academic jobs on jobs.ac.uk are research roles
- 44% of the adverts were placed by institutions in London and the South East of England







- On average recruitment adverts on jobs.ac.uk were posted for 25 days, attracting 645 views and 25 apply clicks
- 63% of these opportunities were for academic, research and teaching jobs
- 30% of these opportunities were for professional and support roles
- Overall 43% of opportunities were within the salary band £30,000 £39,999
- Generally these opportunities were advertised evenly throughout the year with a slight drop in August
- 87% of the opportunities were full time and 42% contract/temporary
- The main recruitment locations were South East England 25%, London 19%, Northern England 19% and Midlands 14%



- The main recruitment locations were South East England 22%, Northern England 20%, London 19% and Midlands 13%
- 86% of academic, research and teaching opportunities were offered on a full-time basis



- 62% of these opportunities were offered on a contract/temporary basis
- 33% of these roles were advertised May-July
- 55% of these roles were marketed at £30,000 £39,999 with 16% at £40,000 £49,999

Some roles may feature in more than one category. For example, if a particular job spans Biological Science and Computer Science it would feature in categories A and B.

- Because these senior level roles require niche, high calibre candidates, the average number of views is lower
- 86% of chair opportunities advertised were permanent, the highest for all roles
- These roles are advertised for longer than other academic roles to attract top talent and allow time for enquiries
- Generally these opportunities don't advertise the salary and welcome contact between the applicant and institution
- The highest percentage of chair roles were advertised in Category C
- The highest percentage of chair roles were advertised in Northern England
- While opportunities for these roles were spread out throughout the year, there was a slight peak in July




- As well as teaching responsibilities, clinical lecturer roles involve leading research groups or spending some time working in a healthcare setting
- As these are speciality roles with smaller pools of candidates, they attract lower views and are usually advertised for longer
- Most of these roles are offered on a full-time basis (70%), although a few clinical lecturer roles are offered on a part-time basis
- Over half of these opportunities were marketed with a salary between £30,000- £39,999
- There is a good balance between permanent (58%) and contract/temporary roles (42%)
- Naturally the main discipline for these roles is Category A





# **Clinical Professor**

- These roles are where members of a profession provide practical instruction to students
- As these are high level roles that require a niche skillset, the average views and apply clicks are much lower
- Most clinical professor opportunities were advertised in the Midlands
- 58% of clinical professor roles are marketed with a salary between £30,000- £39,999
- Naturally the main discipline for these roles is Category A







- As well as teaching responsibilities, clinical researchers carry out clinical trials and research
- Only 14% of clinical researcher opportunities are permanent compared to the jobs.ac.uk academic average of 48%
- A high percentage of these roles are based in London, largely because of the Imperial College London and UCL clinical trials units
- The majority of these roles are marketed at £30,000 £39,999
- Naturally the main discipline for these roles is Category A






- Clinical teaching roles mix lecturing with clinical research and practice
- Although they only made up 0.2% of the academic opportunities on jobs.ac.uk they offered flexibility and variety
- 30% of these roles were part time compared to the jobs.ac.uk academic average of 13%.
- The average salary for this role is £30,000- £39,999
- Naturally the main discipline for these roles is Category A





- Deans are heads of faculties and departments
- Dean opportunities attract higher than average views and are usually advertised for longer
- These roles tend to be offered full time and permanent owing to their senior nature and need for long-term stability. A few are offered on a temporary basis, likely covering a leave of absence on an interim basis
- As you'd expect, these roles are spread out fairly evenly across the UK
- Salaries for these roles are generally not disclosed because they are likely open to negotiation depending on skills and experience
- Most dean roles are advertised in Category C





- These roles involve leading teams, shaping curriculum and overseeing teaching and research across the department
- Owing to the level of responsibility and need for long-term stability, these opportunities tend to be offered on a permanent basis (above average)
- The contract or temporary roles are likely to have been advertised to provide interim cover or because of an increase in funding or the number of research projects
- Compared to the average number of views, these opportunities have a healthy average apply rate
- The highest percentage of these roles are marketed at £50,000- £59,999
- Most of these roles are in Category C



- KTP Associates are part of the Knowledge Transfer Partnership helping to provide businesses with an edge through improved knowledge, technology and skills
- As these roles are project based most are offered on a contract/temporary basis, while 95% of the opportunities advertised were full time
- A large percentage of these opportunities were advertised in Northern England
- 57% of these roles are marketed at £30,000- £39,999
- The majority of these roles are in academic Category B




- As well as teaching, lecturers help to shape curriculum and play a lead role in research
- Lecturer roles are highly sought after with much higher views and apply rates
- Many of these roles offer the security of permanent employment (81% compared to the jobs.ac.uk academic average of 48%)
- Lecturer opportunities make up 23% of the academic roles advertised on jobs.ac.uk
- June and July were the busiest months for advertising opportunities for lecturers
- 83% of lecturer roles offer salaries between £30,000- £49,999
- Most lecturer roles advertised were in Category C




### **Pro Vice-Chancellor**

- Pro Vice-Chancellors shape the future and manage the day-to-day running of institutions
- As these roles are very senior most opportunities advertised were permanent, attracting less views and apply clicks than average
- These opportunities account for only 0.1% of academic roles on jobs.ac.uk but are extremely important, so it's essential to attract the right person
- 40% of Pro Vice-Chancellor opportunities were advertised in February with most of them advertised longer than average
- All salaries stated 'not disclosed' most likely to enable negotiation




- Professors are high-ranking lecturers who have been awarded the title 'Professor' in a particular field of learning
- These opportunities make up 4.5% of academic roles on jobs.ac.uk
- As they are senior roles, they are advertised for longer with 85% offered on a permanent basis (almost double the jobs.ac.uk academic average)
- Despite their high level, these opportunities attract more views and apply clicks than average
- Most of these opportunities were advertised in the Midlands and South East England with Category C advertising the most professor roles
- Most salaries stated 'not disclosed'. Most of the salaries that were advertised were marketed between £50,000 £59,999





- Readers are senior academics with distinguished international reputations in research or scholarship
- These senior opportunities have the highest permanent percentage out of all of the jobs.ac.uk academic higher education roles (94% compared to 42%)
- They are also advertised for the longest time
- These roles have healthy average view and apply rates
- There is a small spike in recruitment March-May
- 59% of these roles are marketed at £50,000- £59,999 with Category D advertising less opportunities





- Researchers, research analysts and scientists work on projects with colleagues, on their own, with different organisations and across different departments in a variety of fields
- 46% of all academic jobs on jobs.ac.uk are research roles
- These roles have high view and apply rates
- As they work on projects and rely on funding many are offered on a contract/temporary basis
- 93% of these opportunities are offered on a full-time basis
- 67% of these roles advertised a salary between £30,000- £39,999
- Most roles were advertised in South East England, most likely because of the University of Oxford

- This job area covers everything from general jobs like scientific officers to specialist roles such as geneticists
- This job area offers a higher percentage of contract roles, yet provides more permanence than researchers, as they are less likely to be project based
- 34% of opportunities were for the South East of England
- Recruitment spikes slightly in March-April
- 61% of these roles offer salaries £30,000- £49,999
- The majority of these roles are in academic categories A and B







- These senior level research roles have a higher than average application rate in comparison to average views
- Owing to the project based nature of research work, the majority of these roles are contracted
- A higher percentage of senior researcher roles are permanent compared to general researcher roles
- 39% of these opportunities were located in South East England, most likely due to the University of Oxford
- There is a slight spike in recruitment June to July
- 85% of these roles offered a salary between £30,000-£49,999

- These high level lecturing roles have a high application rate
- Senior lecturers make up 10% of the academic opportunities advertised on jobs.ac.uk
- 88% of these roles are permanent (the more senior the role, the higher the % of it being permanent)
- Most senior lecturer roles were advertised in Northern England
- May-July saw a slight spike in the number of opportunities
- 49% of the salaries offered were between £40,000- £49,999







- These high level teaching associate roles are mainly advertised on a permanent, full-time basis
- There are notable spikes in job opportunities in January and June
- The majority or roles are in CAT C
- 64% of roles are offered at £40 £49,999






- Teaching Associates and Fellows are postgraduate and doctoral students who teach undergraduate students and support lecturers and researchers
- These opportunities have very high average views and application rates
- Most opportunities are in CAT D
- 64% of roles are offered at £30 £39,999 salary band







- 'Tutors' in this instance reflects tutors, trainers, instructors, demonstrators, mentors and coaches
- There is a very even balance of permanent and contract and full-time and part-time roles
- June-July was the busiest time for advertising job opportunities
- 51% of these roles offer a salary between £25,000- £39,999 with some of these advertised at an hourly rate
